

### **Accessories – Plural of Accessory**

### **Clothing sense**

1a: an object or device that is not essential in itself but adds to the beauty, convenience, or effectiveness of something else auto accessories; clothing accessories




### **Accessories – Plural of Accessory**





### Legal sense

- 2a: a person not actually or constructively present but contributing as an assistant or instigator to the commission of an offense — called also accessory before the fact
- b : a person who knowing that a crime has been committed aids or shelters the offender with intent to defeat justice called also accessory after the fact
